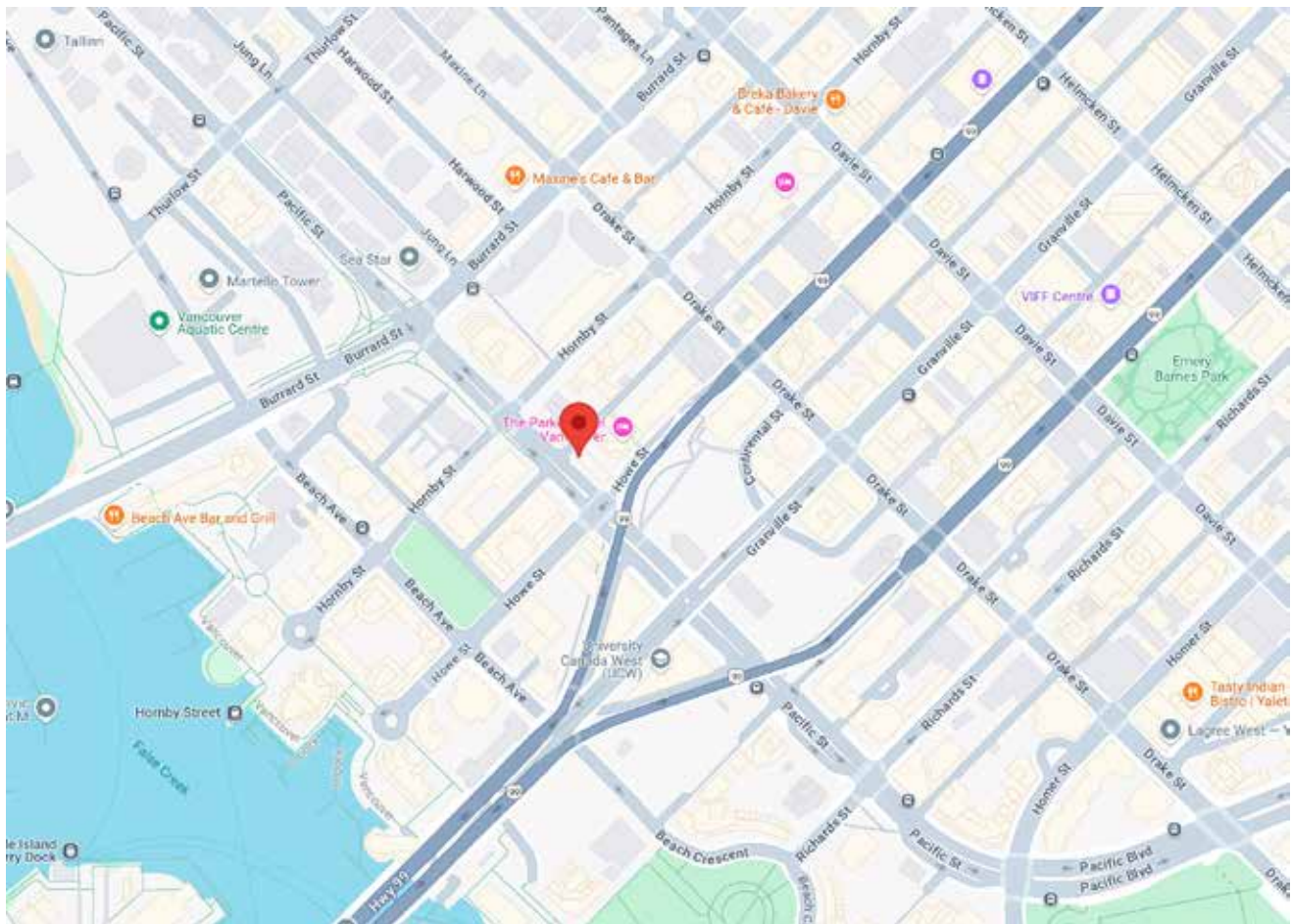
TIT Talks

How to Get There

221A Studios is located at 825 Pacific Street, Vancouver. The main entrance is on Pacific Street between Hornby and Howe.

The Playhouse is one block away from Burrard Street, where you can take a bus from Burrard SkyTrain Station. Many Translink buses pass through downtown. There are also several City of Vancouver Mobi bike-share stations that are located nearby. Please visit www.mobibikes.ca for more details.



Venue Details

The front entrance to the building is wheelchair accessible. The elevator is wheelchair accessible and centrally located. Accessible, single stall, gender neutral, bathrooms are on every floor. Two double stall universal bathrooms with accessible showers are located on the basement floor. Service animals are welcome in the building. An emergency power supply on all power operated doors. Areas of refuge can be found on each floor.

Two VIBF Community Safety Liaisons will also be on site at every event. Community Safety Liaisons are volunteers who will be briefed and trained in VIBF policies and procedures and best practices for community safety prior to every VIBF event. Community Safety Liaisons can be approached by audience members, performers, volunteers, or any other VIBF personnel at VIBF events who may wish to report concerns or request VIBF Board follow-up on any incidents.

At all VIBF events, Community Safety Liaisons will be identifiable via their 'Community Safety Liaison' badges, and event hosts will indicate how attendees can report any concerns to Community Safety Liaisons during events.

What Can I do to Make the Space Safer and More Inclusive?

Please help keep yourself and others safe - at all times when you are not eating or drinking, we strongly encourage you to please continue to wear a mask that covers your nose and mouth. Be respectful of others' choices, including to continue to wear a mask and physically distance.

Set your phones to vibrate or silent, and put them away during the show. No photos or videos are allowed from audience members during the show, though we encourage you to take photos and videos in the lobby and before and after the show.

Abide by the VIBF Code of Conduct.

Be respectful of performers, staff, volunteers, and other audience members. Please keep the space free of strong perfumes or scented body products. Please refrain from bringing food into the space, especially products containing nuts.
