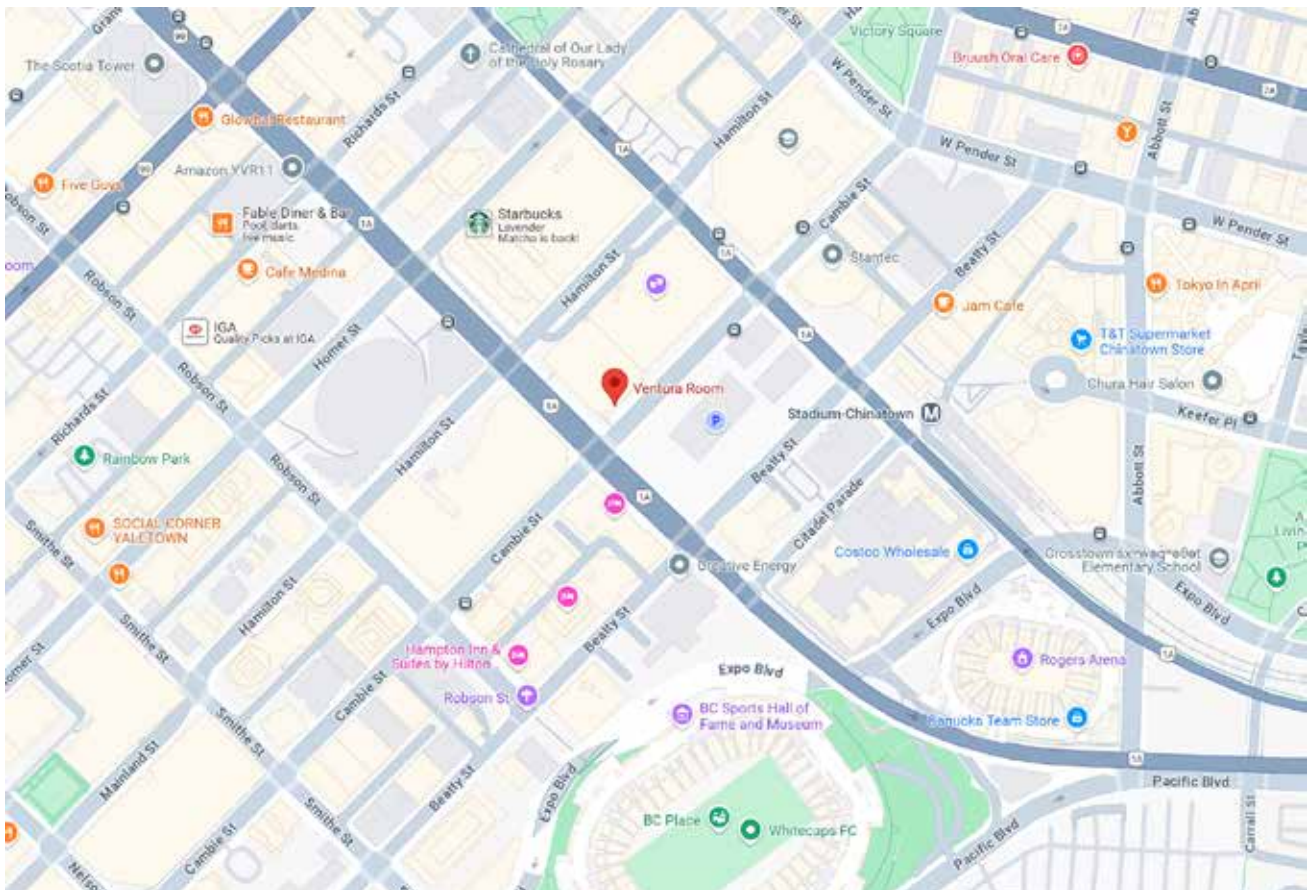

How to Get There

Ventura Room is located at 695 Cambie Street, Vancouver. The main entrance is on Cambie Street at street level.

Ventura room is one block away from the Stadium-Chinatown SkyTrain station, and four blocks away from the Vancouver City Centre SkyTrain station. Many Translink buses pass through downtown. There are also several City of Vancouver Mobi bike-share stations that are located nearby. Please visit www.mobibikes.ca for more details.

Parking is available at the Queen Elizabeth Theatre parkade, beneath the theatre itself. The entrance is off of Cambie Street between West Georgia and Dunsmuir Streets. Parking is limited, so arrive early. The cost for parking for an evening event is \$16. Accessible parking is available at the Queen Elizabeth Theatre parkade with an accessible parking decal on a first-come, first-served basis, with a limited number available. This includes extra space designated to allow access to and from a vehicle (12' wide; 26' high) and spaces to park mobility scooters. To reserve an accessible parking space, phone 604-665-2193 at least one week before the performance.



Venue Details

This space is wheelchair accessible. There is an entrance at street level where you can go down 2 stairs with a handrail or by a small elevator. They have a wheelchair accessible large open washroom available. Chairs are a combination of high stools, armless sturdy chairs and benches.



What Can I do to Make the Space Safer and More Inclusive?

Please help keep yourself and others safe - at all times when you are not eating or drinking, we strongly encourage you to please continue to wear a mask that covers your nose and mouth. Be respectful of others' choices, including to continue to wear a mask and physically distance.

Set your phones to vibrate or silent, and put them away during the show. No photos or videos are allowed from audience members during the show, though we encourage you to take photos and videos in the lobby and before and after the show.
